
Welcome to the CCIC Newsletter!



Inclusive College Program Spotlights



Inclusive Programs Shine Across California

This quarter, the California Center for Inclusive College (CCIC) collaborated with college campuses across the state, including Fresno State Wayfinders, and CSU San Marcos Aspiring Scholars, to connect with program directors and observe inclusive excellence in action. Highlights included student housing, observed vocational internships at sites, and witnessed how peer mentors and faculty partners create equitable academic and residential spaces for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Highlight: CSU Fresno Wayfinders



Wayfinders is a 2-year non-degree inclusive independent living certificate program for young adults with intellectual disabilities. Participants of Wayfinders enhance their independence by residing in student apartments, participating in work experience internships, enrolling in courses at Fresno State through Open University, and actively participating in the community.

Wayfinders is recognized as a Comprehensive Transition and Post-Secondary Program and participants who complete the program receive a Work Readiness and Life Skills Certificate.
