The California Center for Inclusive College (CCIC) is a statewide technical assistance center committed to making higher education accessible to students with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Through collaboration with colleges and universities across the state, the CCIC helps support, strengthen, and expand Inclusive College Programs (ICPs) for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities to enroll in academic courses, explore career pathways, and fully engage in campus and community life.

Across California, there are more than 22 colleges, universities, and community colleges offering post-secondary education experiences for students with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities.

Celebrating the UC Davis Redwood SEED Scholars Class of 2025!



In May 2025, California celebrated a milestone in inclusive higher education: the first four-year cohort of graduates from the UCD Redwood SEED Scholars program crossed the finish line after completing their 4-year college program. Launched in 2021, this program supports students with intellectual and developmental disabilities in pursuing higher education through the opportunity for a full 4-year college experience. SEED graduates represent an important step forward in creating equitable access to inclusive college for students with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
